Programme Planning Term 3

Goal: Children will be Kawenga
(taking responsibility)

Indicator 1: Children will develop self-help and self-care skills

Indicator 2: Children will take responsibility for looking after the environment

This term we are learning about taking responsibility. As apart of this we have created lanyards of the different areas we need to tidy up at Kindergarten. The tidy up leaders are each given a lanyard and they are responsible for ensuring the area is tidy with the help of friends. The children take great pride in their areas and really focus on getting the job.



How can you support this terms program planning:

- If you arrive before the end of day whariki role model helping to tidy up at kindy (As so many of you are great at doing).
- Give children some responsibilities at home such as putting their lunch box on the kitchen bench when they get home from kindy, helping to tidy up their toys or getting the cutlery ready at tea time.
- Encourage children to put put their lunch box on the shelf and gumboots by their bag at kindy.
- When they have a problem offering them strategies to solve it themselves or for the older children ask them how they going to solve that problem.
- Celebrating when they are being Kawenga, with a high five
