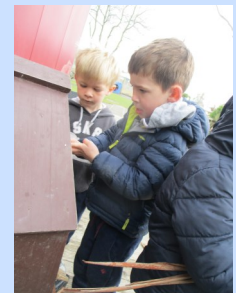
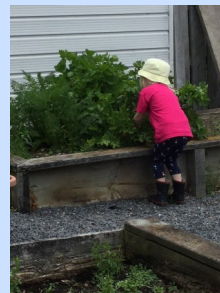

Planning so far this term...

We have been learning about Kaitiakitanga - this translates to a way of respecting and caring for the environment.

- Children have been learning about looking after our Kindy environment and the animals and insects in it, while also learning about Papatuanuku the earth mother.
- Children have had opportunities to plant and grow a range of herb and sunflower seeds.
